# Pod 2A's Pathways to Success!

In Pod2A we have been working together to understand and construct a clear success criteria. The success criteria display in our room has aligned the DECD achievement standards with concepts taken from SOLO Taxonomy. Together these tools allow us to collaboratively map our learning, identify how much of the learning intention we have met and also shows us the next step we need to take to extend our learning further.

"In the success criteria we have been able to see what level we are at in work" – Breeana.

"When we look at the success criteria we use our work samples to see what level we are on and try to aim higher in our work to achieve a higher standard for a better grade" – Hailey.

"The success criteria display has shown that I need to ask for feedback from the teacher regularly to make sure I know what to do next when I think I have finished my work" – Deanna.

"The words on the wall help us achieve higher and as we make mistakes we learn" – Tia.

"We are using the success criteria to help us aim for a higher grade than we got last year" – Kate.

"The success criteria gives us a specific target to aim for which helps to get better grades and marks. Eventually this makes us a lot smarter which helps lots for getting better jobs that don't give you two dollars a week" – Alex.

## **GOVERNING COUNCIL AGM**

## FREE FOOTSTEPS DISCO

This year we are once again offering a free disco for students between 6:00 and 7:30 on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February. Parents/ caregivers are to drop off their children at the disco at 6:00 at the door nearest the canteen. The disco will be run by the Footsteps company and supervised by staff. Students must remain in the disco for the entire period. Students who attend must be dropped off and picked up by an adult.

## IN-SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY



This year we pleased to announce that In-School will be offering their services on site and free of charge for students. In-School Psychology provides psychological services to children, adolescents, their families, and schools. The psychologists at In-School Psychology are experts in child and adolescent

psychology and are professionals dedicated to providing outstanding and comprehensive services to assist children and adolescents, their families and their schools. In-School Psychology's service is bulk billed to Medicare through the Better Access to Mental Health Care initiative. A child or adolescent is able to access the free counselling service when a Health Care Plan is filled out by the child/adolescent's General Practitioner or Paediatrician. Each Health Care Plan entitles the child/adolescent to a maximum of 10 individual sessions and 10 group sessions each calendar year. Children under the age of 13 with a diagnosed Autism Spectrum Disorder are entitled to a maximum of 20 sessions bulk billed to Medicare.

Children and adolescents are commonly referred for issues such as:

- Friendship problems (making and keeping friends)
- Dealing with bullying
- Anxiety (including school refusal)
- Depression
- Fears and phobias
- Anger management & behavioural difficulties (at home and/or school)
- Self-harm
- Sleep problems (night terrors, insomnia)
- Alcohol or substance abuse
- Attention deficit and hyperactivity
- Social skills difficulties
- Grief and loss
- Eating disorders
- Autism (developing social skills, anxiety etc.)
